Key Aspects of Webster

- ▶ Arrive in the main lot parking 1:00 PM. Check-in is in the main parking lot, not the campsite. We will get your gear to the site.
- ▶ Camp ends Friday evening with a barbeque and campfire that Parents are welcome to attend. There is a fee for the barbeque.
- ▶ Bicycles are allowed.
- ▶ We will attend breakfast together after chores are complete.
- ▶ Lunch is buffet style. Sit at our assigned tables.
- ▶ Dinner is family style with waiters. Class A.
- ▶ No scouts should be in our campsite from the time we leave for breakfast until 1PM.

Swim Test

- ▶ Troop will be testing this Saturday at 9AM
 - ▶ Treadwell
 - ▶ 3 laps free style, 1 lap backstroke, float
- ▶ Determines where scouts/adults may go at the waterfront.
- ▶ Can retake at summer camp during Orientation or Saturday, July 1 at 9AM.

Totin' Chip

- ▶ First Year scouts will be trained in Knife safety as part of First Class Path.
- ▶ We will have an older scout train any other scouts not in the First Class Path program that wants a Totin' Chip.
- ▶ After training the Scoutmaster will test you on Knife Safety.
- ▶ The Scoutmaster has final say on if you earn your Totin' Chip.
- ▶ The Scoutmaster reserves the right to take away any Totin' Chip if a scout is not using a knife properly.
- ▶ Scouts without a Totin' Chip may not be in possession of a knife.

What to Bring

Class A

Please note: Scouts and leaders will wear Field Uniform (uniform shirt with trousers/shorts and belt) to dinner each day. Activity Uniform (Scouting T-shirt with trousers/shorts and belt) is the recommended attire for breakfast, lunch, and program areas unless special clothing, like swimwear, is required.

Class B

New Class B shirts will be handed out when you arrive at camp. Bring any old ones you have as well.

Cell Phones

- ▶ If you have your Cyber Chip you may bring your cell phone.
- ▶ Cell phone may only be used for BSA Activities, such as research for a merit badge or lyrics for a campfire song. Ask an adult before using the cell phone.
- ▶ Cell phones used for non-BSA Activities will be confiscated and returned to a parent at the end of camp.
- ▶ Webster strictly forbids the use of cell phones in dining halls.



Snacks

- ▶ Skunks and Racoons and Bears all love snacks.
- ▶ Snacks must not be stored in a trunk or a tent. Skunks and Racoons are resourceful, they will get into your trunk or try really, really hard to do so.
